### Project #606: Fall Leaves!

- Cut out various leaf shapes, big, small, broken, whole etc. out of various colours of paper to reflect the changes in fall colours. Try red, green, yellow, brown, orange.
- If you make the leaves large enough the children may be able to glue small leaves onto the larger leaves.
- Try adding a bit of paper to form the colours of Fall Leaves.
- Tissue paper bits are great for this. They can be flat and blend the colours by overlapping the colours. Watch it change colours.
- Bingo dabbers are also very good for this project.
- Q Tip painting is also nice and easy to do.
- Try placing a large leaf on an easel to paint.
- Try stapling two larger leaves together leaving one end open to "Stuff" the leaves with scrap paper.
- Make a leaf mobile by using smaller leaf shapes and hanging by a string from a Branch from nature.

#### Activity: Leaf and branch hunt!

Go for a nature walk to find what you need for your project. Leaves and branches that have fallen to the ground.

#### Song: See them Falling! (tune "Are you Sleeping")

See them falling, see them falling. (Children hold leaves and drop them)

To the ground, to the ground,

(Children may dance and fall to the ground as leaves)
