Project #646: Polar Bears

- Cut out the shape of a polar bear from a template. Children who are able to follow the lines cutting may be able to help with this.
- Draw in some details on the bear shape such as fur lines, leg and paw details, eyes and nose and mouth details too if the children like. Remember this is all how the child perceives the bear to look.
- Then when you are done drawing and colouring, you may like to add stretched cotton balls onto the Polar Bear shape to imitate the fur of the bear. These may be glued on with a glue stick. Please encourage children to cover the bear with the glue first and then add the cotton. (cotton sticks very easily to the bear but also sticks to the glue stick so encourage glue onto the paper)
- String or wool may also be used for the bear by glueing it on as well. Non toxic white liquid glue may be best for this string or wool.
- Try making more than one bear for a friend for the first bear.
- Glue your bear or bears onto another piece of paper.
- Create a scene with snow and trees for scenery.
- Try making a mobile of bears by attaching a few bears to a stick hanging with some string.
